Klaus-Dirk Henke

Klaus-Dirk Henke studied Economics and Social Sciences at the University of Cologne, Germany, and at the London School of Economics from 1963 to 1968. After studies at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, USA, he received his doctoral degree from the University of Cologne in 1970. From 1970 to 1976 he held assistant professorships at the Universities of Cologne and Marburg and he was visiting scholar at the Brookings Institution, Washington, D. C. He received his habilitation from the University of Marburg in 1976. From 1976 to 1995 he held a professorship for Economics at the University of Hannover, Germany. He was visiting professor at the University of Vienna and the University of Bristol. Since 1995 he is Professor of Economics (Public Finance and Health Economics) at the Technical University of Berlin. From 1996-2004, he has been director at the European Centre for Comparative Government and Public Policy, Berlin.

Prof. Henke received scholarships from the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD), from the German Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and from the German National Science Council.

From 1987 to 1998, Prof. Henke was member of the Advisory Board for the Concerted Action in Health Care in Germany of which he was Chairman from 1993 to 1998. Since 1984 he has served as a member of the Advisory Board to the German Ministry of Finance. From 1989 to 1991 he was president of the European Health Care Management Association.

Prof. Henke is Editor of the book series *Europäische Schriften zu Staat und Wirtschaft* (since 1999) and of the *Journal of Public Health / Zeitschrift für Gesundheitswissenschaften* (since 1993).

Univ.-Prof. Dr. Klaus-Dirk Henke ist seit 1995 Inhaber des Lehrstuhls für die Fachgebiete Öffentliche Finanzen und Gesundheitsökonomie am Institut für Volkswirtschaftslehre und Wirtschaftsrecht der Technischen Universität Berlin. Er ist seit 1984 Mitglied des Wissenschaftlichen Beirats beim Bundesministerium der Finanzen. Von 1987 - 1998 war er Mitglied und von 1993 - 1998 Vorsitzender des Sachverständigenrates für die Konzertierte Aktion im Gesundheitswesen. Seit 2004 ist er ein Sprecher des Zentrums für Innovative Gesundheitstechnologie (ZiG) an der TU Berlin. Er arbeitet hauptsächlich auf den Gebieten der Gesundheitsökonomie, Sozialen Sicherung, Europäischen Integration sowie zu finanzwissenschaftlichen Fragestellungen.
